American Cancer Society

- ACS publishes Cancer Prevention and Early Detection as well as papers that use publicly
 available datasets to estimate yearly tobacco-use prevalence and cessation at the national and
 state levels. ACS documents associations between tobacco-use prevalence and tobacco
 control policies, and uses these reports to advocate for stricter tobacco control policies.
- ACS conducts the Cancer Prevention Study, a national survey of approximately 500,000 volunteers that includes questions on tobacco use and cessation treatment.

American Society of Clinical Oncology

• As part of its effort to build awareness and encourage cessation counseling, in 2006 ASCO began integrating smoking-related measures into the ASCO Quality Oncology Practice Initiative®, a quality improvement program that enables oncology practices to assess their performance relative to their peers on a menu of quality measures.

• We conduct polls to determine the level of public support for tobacco control policies including funding for tobacco prevention and cessation.

CDC Office on Smoking and Health

• OSH does not conduct longitudinal surveillance, however, OSH supports several surveys with cessation related questions.

North American Quitline Consortium

- NAQC Annual Survey collects data on quitline services and promotions.
- Provide technical assistance to states to help implement quit rate and reach standards.
